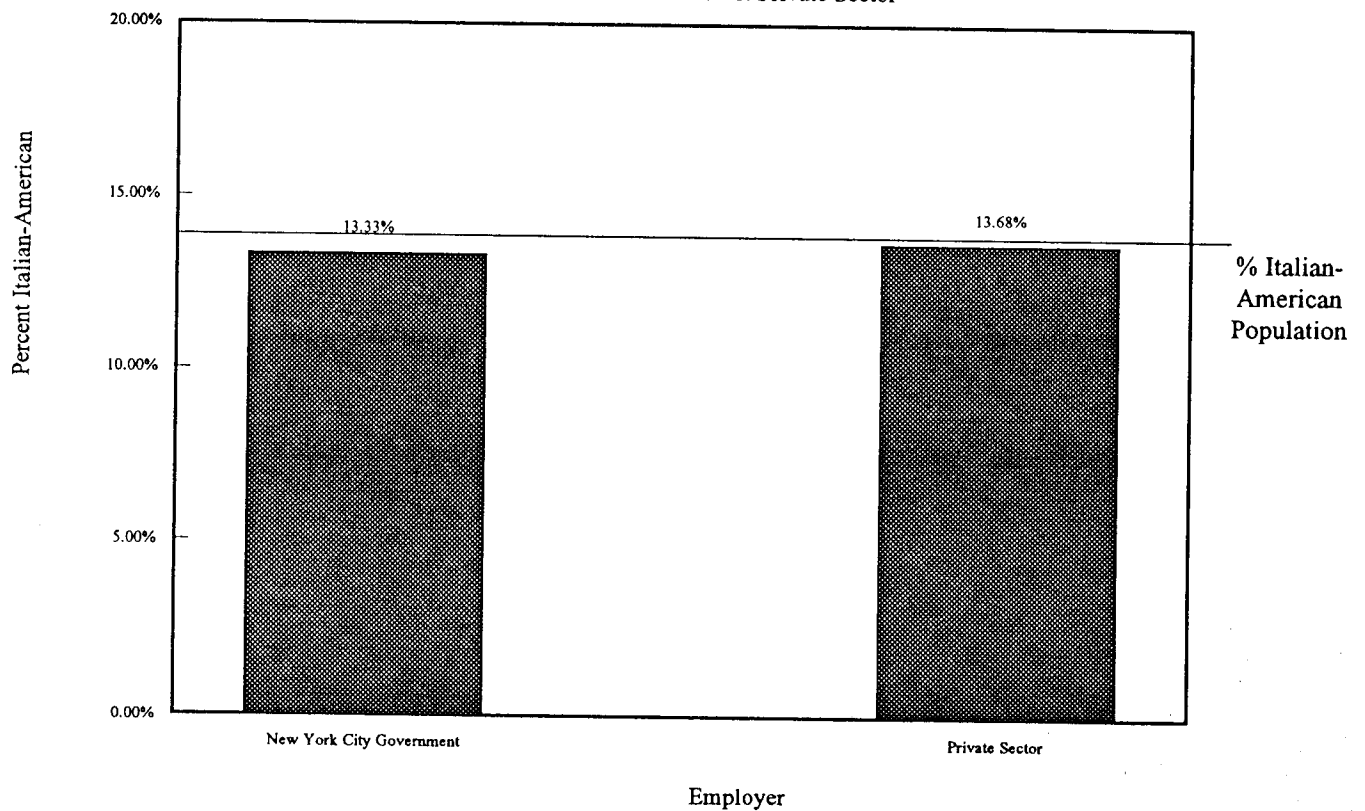

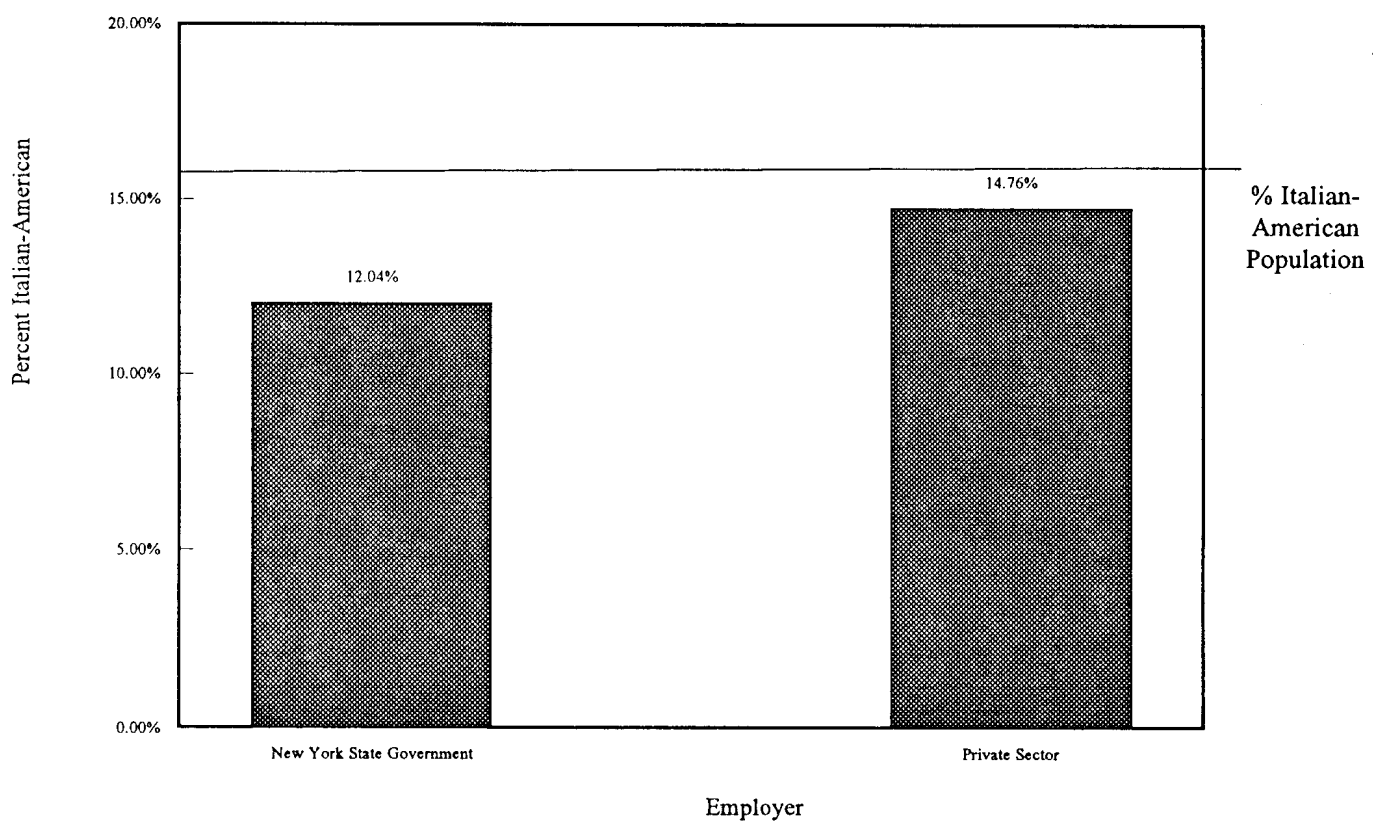
Government vs. Private Sector

Government vs. Private Sector

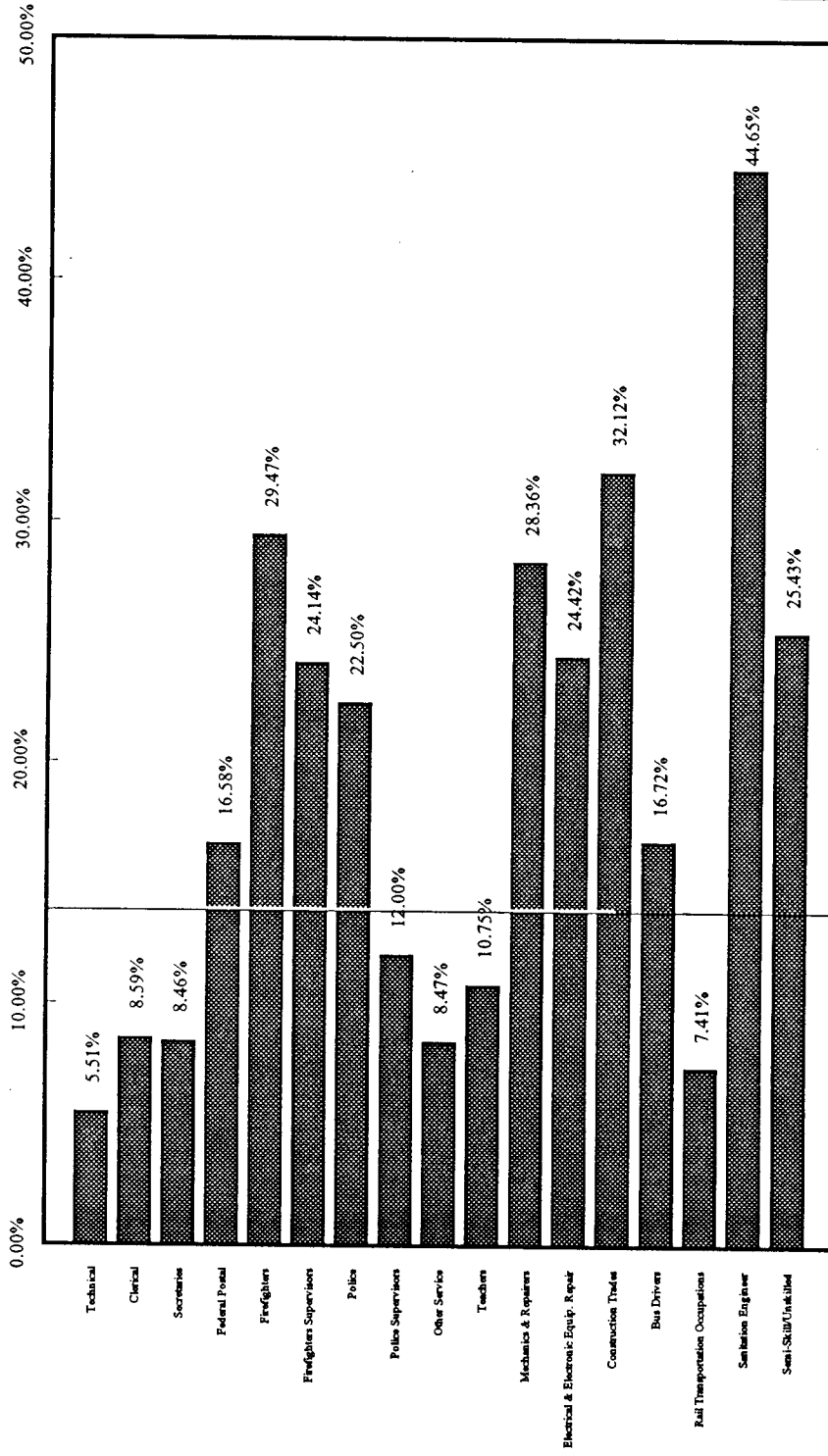

### Percent Italian-Americans



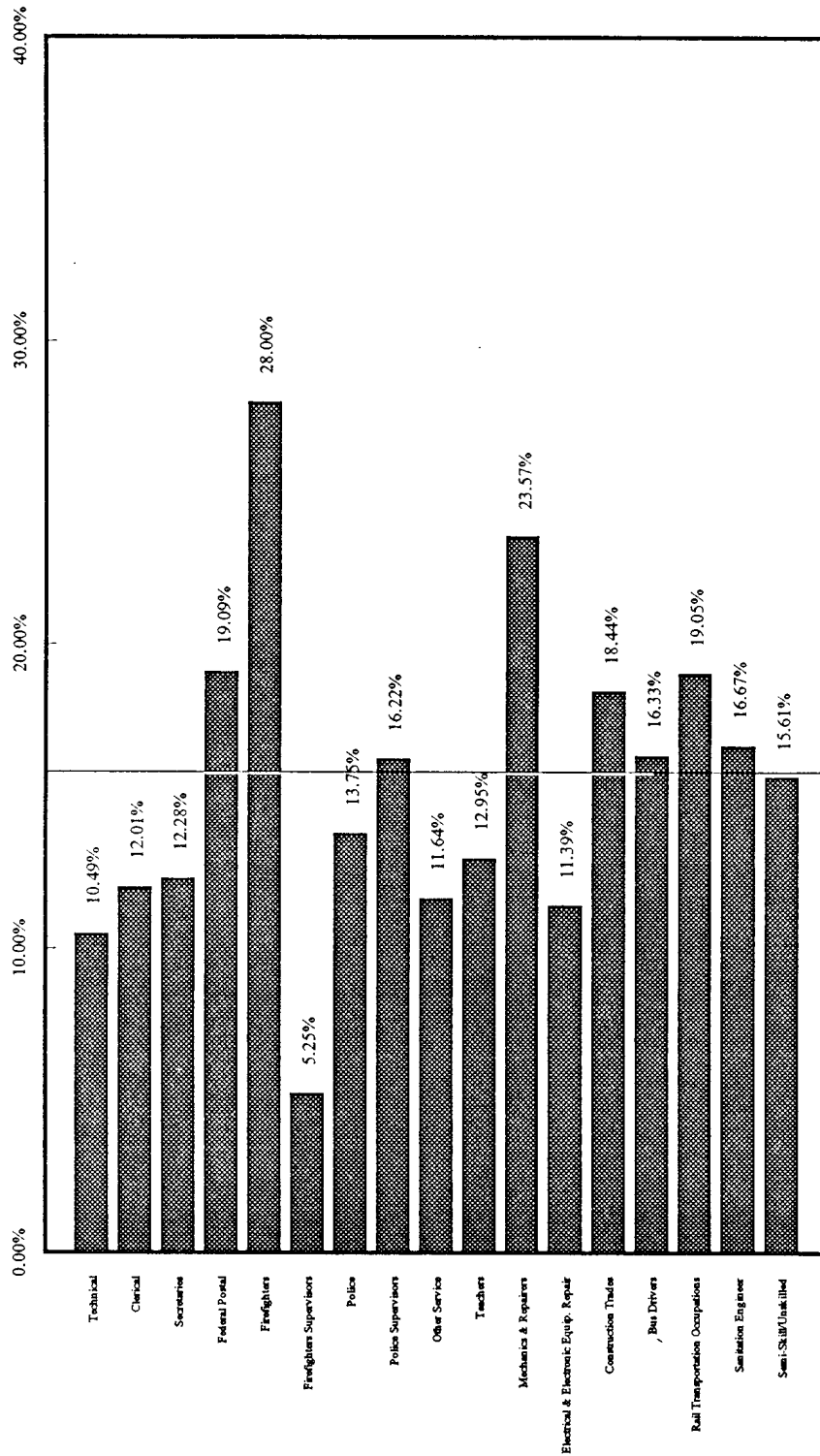

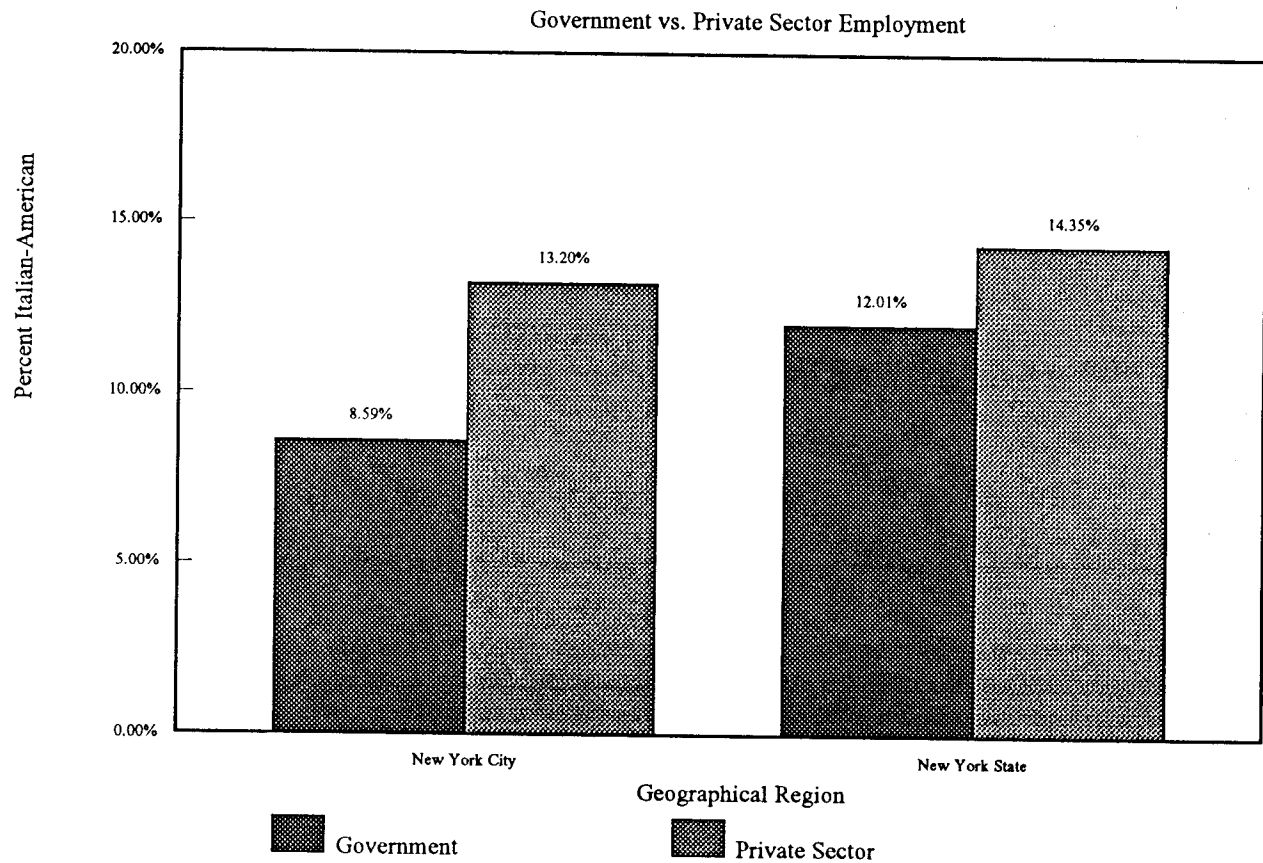
## Italian-American Representation in Teacher Occupations

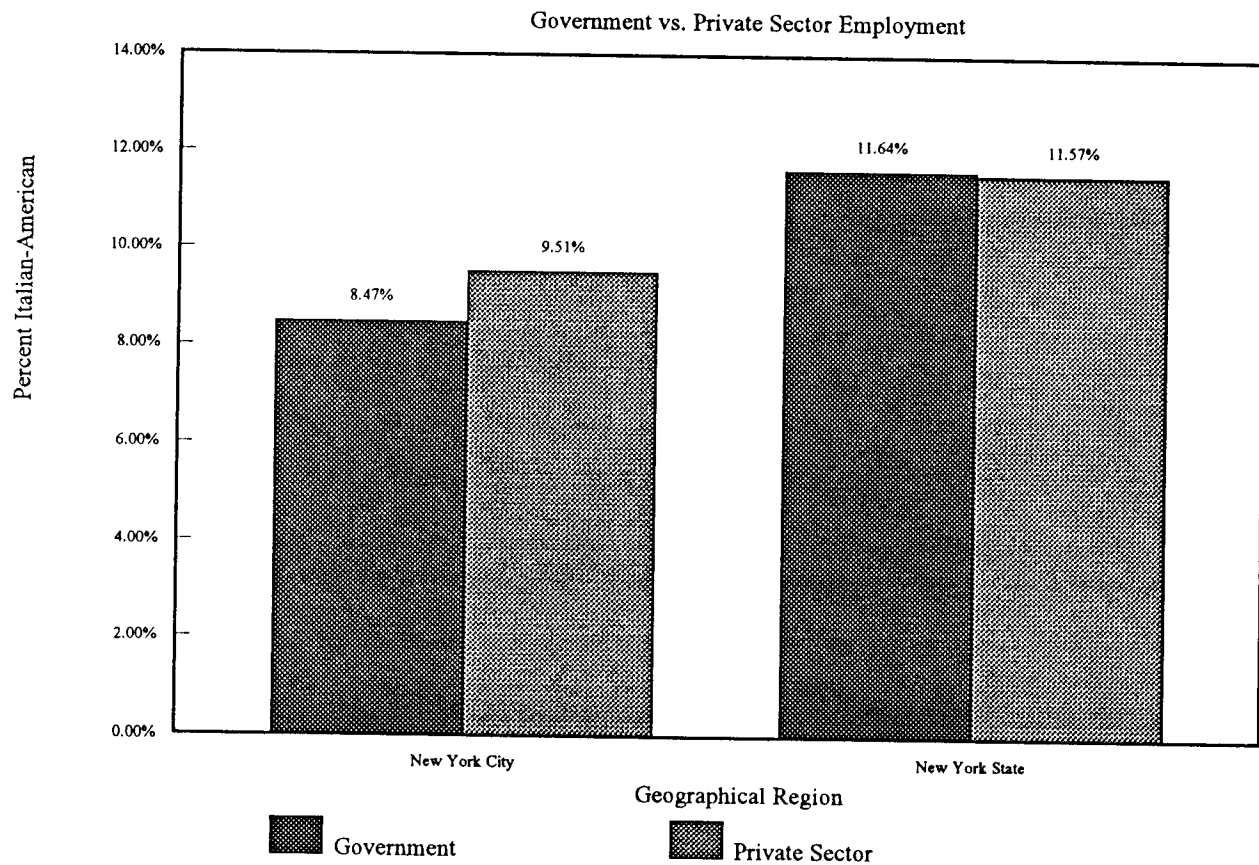

# Italian-American Representation in Bus Driver Occupations



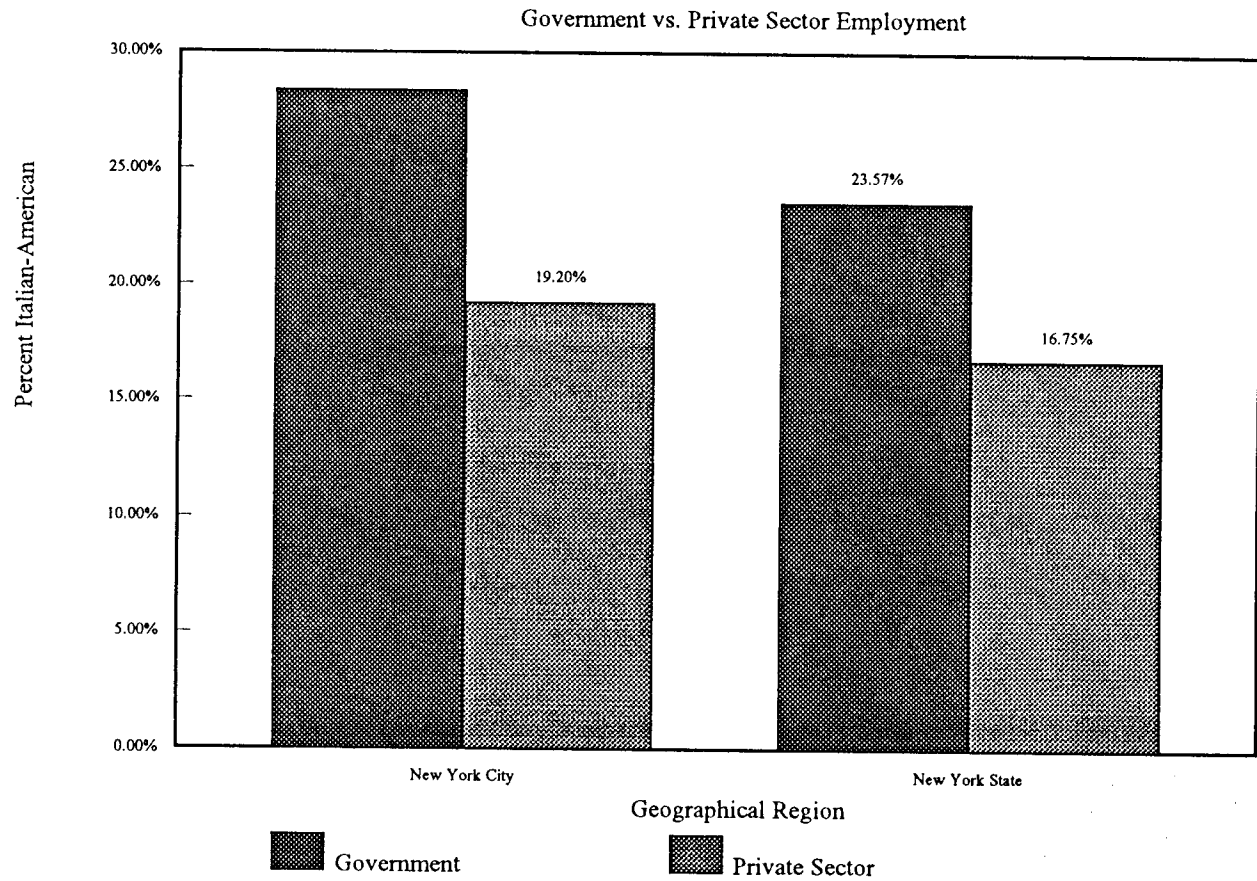

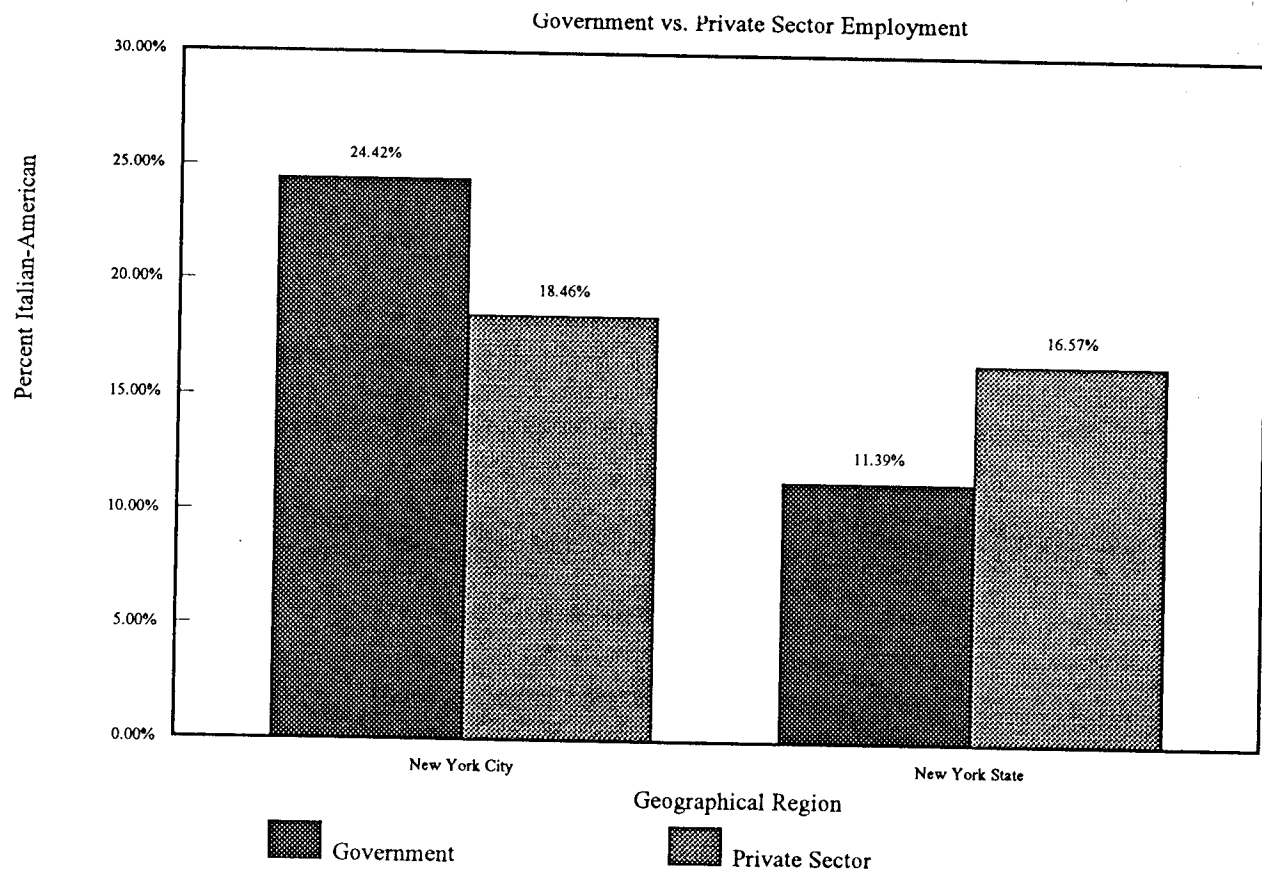

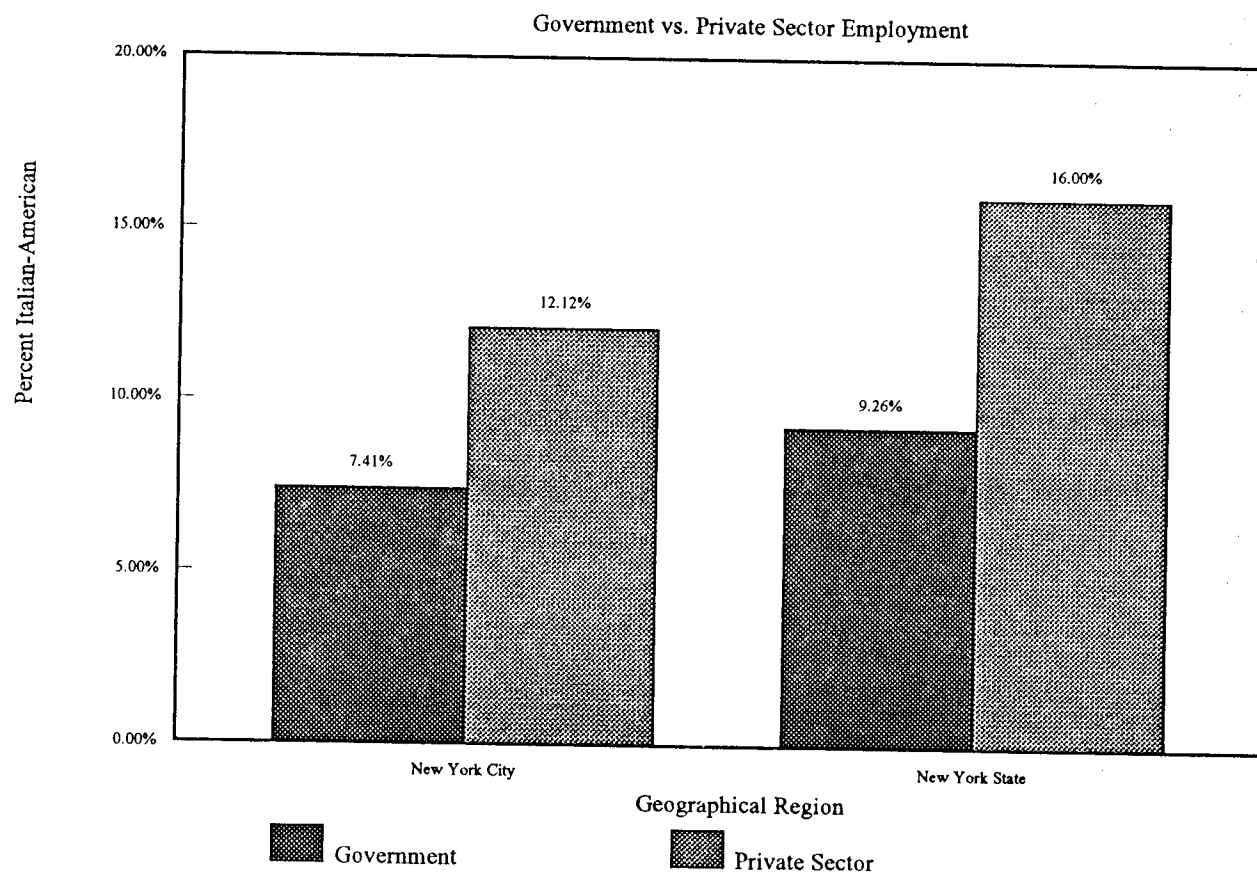

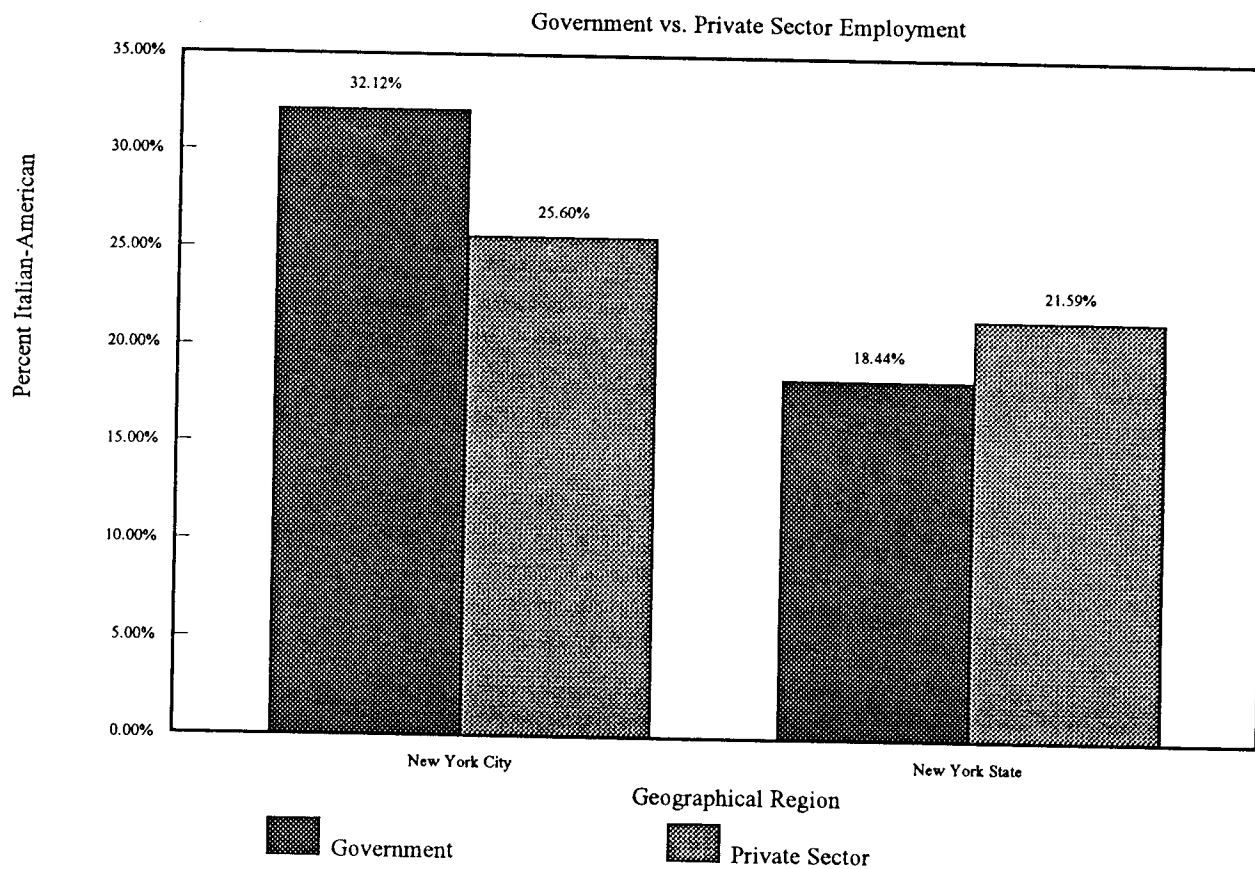

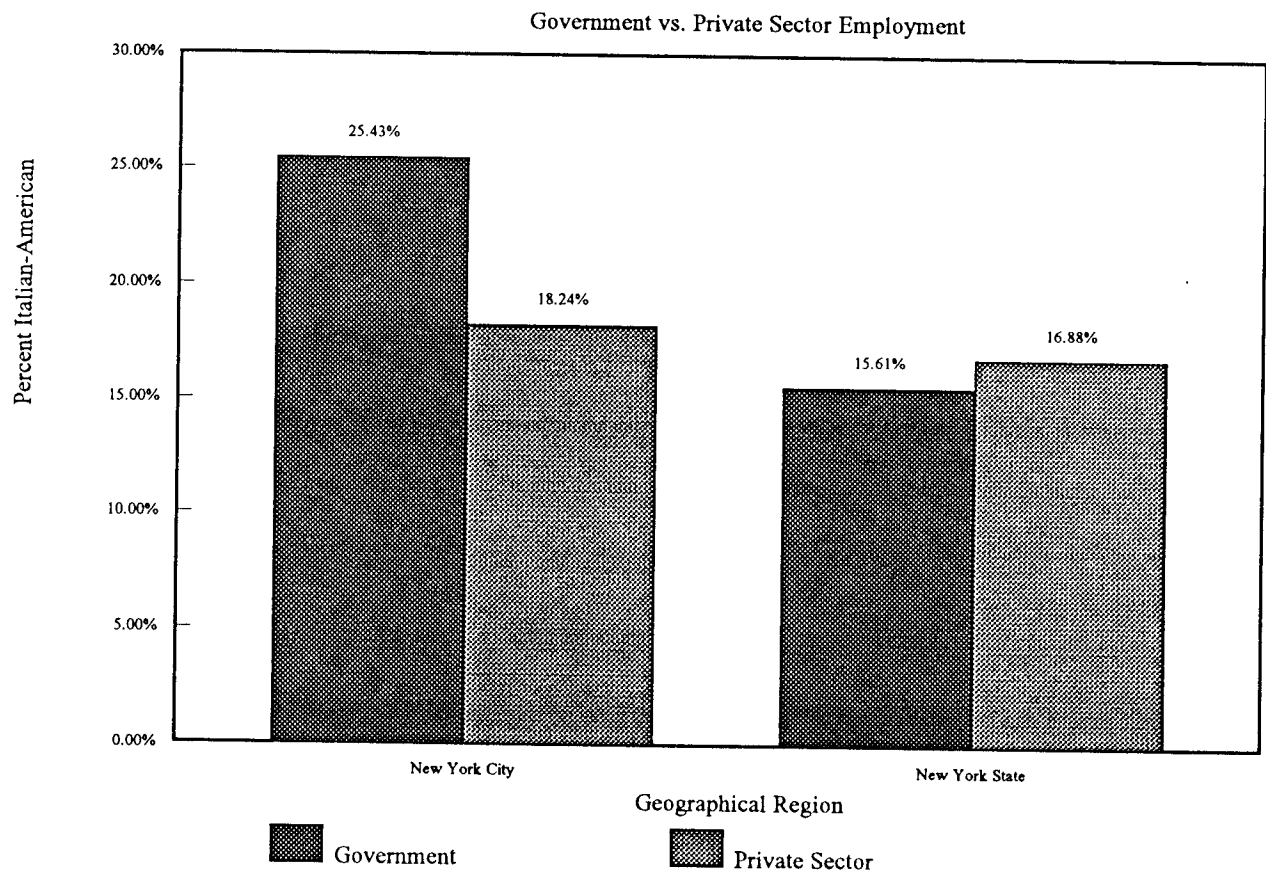
